

# Not Afraid of the Gang

"We will never be discouraged and will not be afraid," the students said to the pastor. "We will face any problems for the sake of Christ."

Their boldness surprised and encouraged the pastor. He decided to go with the group of young people to the gang's neighborhood—a rough area known as a haven for drug addicts and criminals.

Soon enough the believers encountered the gang. The students, speaking with kindness, quickly invited the gang to watch the Kurumba translation of the *JESUS* film. They agreed.

Each gang member watched the film intently to the very end. The students could tell some of them were immediately convicted of their actions.

"We want to change," several of the gang members said. After witnessing the redeeming power of Christ on film, they all asked the students to return and help them break free of their former ways.

Mary's\* head hung low as she stepped into the training facility, her heart troubled by the situation back home. One of the only Christians in the area, she'd endured a great deal of persecution as of late—even from her own family. Regardless, she wanted to attend this training and learn to use the new Ndola *JESUS* film in her community.

A few months earlier, Mary had come up with a plan to send her 10 children to school. She would raise 40 goats and a dozen chickens to help pay for her children's education.

But when she walked out to her farm one day to check on the animals, Mary discovered them all dead.

They had been poisoned.

While no one admitted to the crime, Mary had a strong feeling about who the culprits were: her family. They'd made it known time and time again they didn't like her being a Christian. They knew killing her animals and postponing her children's education would hurt Mary deeply.

Mary knew God called His people to forgive others, but was this crime too much? Could she really forgive them?

Weeks later at the training event, Nigerian Jesus Film Project® coordinator Rev. Joseph and his team showed *Walking With Jesus* to Mary and the other attendees. The five-episode series uses portrayals of African life and culture to teach viewers how to grow in their relationship with Christ. In the second episode, a village chief learns about forgiveness.

Seeing the episode helped Mary realize her own need to let go. At the end of the day, she stood in front of the entire group of trainees and told them how God was helping her forgive her family.

Through the Jesus Film Project training and her own decision to forgive, Mary's relationship with God has deepened. She's discovered a longing to serve him more by sharing His Word with others. In a recent update to Rev. Joseph, Mary reported she has started the church-planting process in two villages by showing the *JESUS* film in Ndola.





Reverend Joseph, featured in the Spring 2018 report, continues to work tirelessly alongside Mission 865. After completing a new translation of *JESUS*, Rev. Joseph helps organize multiple trainings for local Christians like Mary. The trainings span several days and incorporate other Jesus Film Project® materials such as *Walking With Jesus*. The weeklong event leads up to a premiere showing of *JESUS* in the local language put on by the trainees.

Akida waded through a river near the border with two other Tanzanian soldiers. Suddenly one of his feet lodged under the root of a tree, trapping him. As he bent down to remove the obstruction, gunfire whizzed overhead. When he looked up, he saw his fellow soldiers lying dead near the shore.

If he'd been standing a second earlier, he would have been shot. God had spared Akida's life.



As day turned to night, Ugandan soldiers passed over him, unaware of Akida hiding beneath the dead bodies. Finally amazingly—Akida's brother approached with his troop. Akida recognized his brother's voice and climbed out from his hiding spot among the dead. He embraced his brother, overjoyed and thankful to be alive.

Before his involvement in the Tanzania-Uganda war in the 1970s, Akida grew up in Tanzania. He spoke Zanaki as his first language. After leaving the military, Akida attended secondary school, where he

learned English. He went on to receive a degree in theology and now works as a Bible ftranslator.

Most recently Akida helped translate and record the Zanaki JESUS film as part of Mission 865.

There are many denominations among the Zanaki in Tanzania. But Akida says the majority of Zanakis who follow Christ hold on to indigenous beliefs such as animism and idol worship.

Akida believes the need is great for *JESUS* in Zanaki, and he is thankful God spared his life so he could help bring it to them. Through this film Akida is confident his countrymen and women will see the Bible—and the true Jesus—come to life in their heart language.
